

The California Water Plan


First published in 1957 as Bulletin 3

- > Updated 9 times (Bulletin 160); last one in 2009
- DWR required by law (Water Code) to update the Water Plan every 5 years; next one in 2013
- Growing interest by Legislature and stakeholders
- Part of Governor's Strategic Growth Initiative



- 8. Develop preliminary sustainability indicators




