

- We All Have a Role to Play in Securing Our Future







Encompass all or a portion of 16 counties in CA

 Over 15,700 square miles and represents 9.9% of the State area

- Origin of more than 40% of the State's developed water supply
- Include ten (10) IRWM groups
 (Upper Feather River Watershed, North Sac Valley, Yuba County, ARB, CABY, MAC, T-Stan, Yosemite-Mariposa, Madera, Southern Sierra)
