
## Aging Systems/Rising Costs

Major projects are 76 yrs old (avg)


- LA Aqueduct (1908)

- State Water Project (1970)




# Climate Change - Snowpack

- California Water Data Consortium




### Hope: Water Supply Strategy

- 2.4 MAF/Yr increase in recycled, Desal, stormwater capture by 2040
- 4 MAF expansion of storage capacity by 2040, equivalent of new Shasta Reservoir
- 500k AF/Yr conservation
- Total 6.9 MAF increased capacity by 2040. Equivalent to ~18% increase in overall supply

# Hope: CEQA Reform

- Gov Newsom has proposed CEQA streamline for all Prop 1 projects, including:
  - Delta Conveyance
  - Water recycling/desalination
  - 2.8 MAF of new storage:
    - Sites Reservoir
    - Los Vaqueros Expansion
    - Pacheco Reservoir Expansion
    - Willow Springs
    - Harvest Water
    - Chino Basin


