Placer County Regional Forest Health (RFH) Program

Regional Forest Health Program: Established in May 2021 with the aim of improving forest health and reducing the risk and impact of wildfires in Placer County.

County's Commitment: The County has prioritized forest health and wildfire management as top land use planning and legislative policy priorities in recent years.

Interdisciplinary Approach: The RFH program integrates forest management and wildfire risk reduction strategies across County departments and coordinates with State and federal agencies and local partners.




Forest Health and Snowpack Research

- Snow accumulation
- Snow melt
- Soil moisture
- Streamflow
- Forest health (e.g. tree growth and mortality)



Water Quality, Quantity and Sedimentation

Sediment eroded from King Fire six months after fire ~40 river miles below fire scar. US Forest Service estimated 300,000+ tons of topsoil eroded. Confluence of Middle (lower) and North Forks of American River, April 27, 2015.
